for younger children

uring the grammar stage of learning, children DISCOVER the building blocks for Dall other learning in future years. Teaching focuses on learning about God and His world, how to read and write, and an overview of history from Creation to the present.



INVESTIGATE

for family learning through 8th grade

In the logic stage of learning, children INVESTIGATE cause and effect as they begin to think more analytically and understand how facts fit together into a logical framework. Integrating Bible, chronological history, geography, science, literature, music, and art helps children to understand the world around them.



DECLARE

for high school students

uring the rhetoric stage of learning, students learn to apply the rules of logic to their knowledge in order to DECLARE their conclusions both verbally and in writing. My Father's World integrates Bible, history, and English to help students grow in their understanding of a Biblical worldview.


Where Should I Start? (refer to the chart on the right)

- If You Have Children in Preschool 3rd Grade:
- Start each child in the appropriate DISCOVER curriculum. Your 2nd or 3rd grader (with no older siblings in 4th – 8th grade) will use Adventures in U.S. History for one year and begin the Multi-age Family Learning Cycle the next year.
- ightharpoonup If You Have Children in 4th 8th Grade (and siblings in 2^{nd} 3^{rd} grade): The INVESTIGATE Multi-age Family Learning Cycle begins with Exploring Countries and Cultures for all 2nd - 8th graders. Younger children will still use the appropriate preschool, kindergarten, or 1st grade program while enjoying some of their older siblings' activities. Your family will advance through the Multi-age Family Learning Cycle each year. When younger children reach 2nd grade, they fully join their older siblings in the same cycle year the others are studying. Each child will continue through the Multi-age Family Learning Cycle until completing the 8th grade.
- If You Have Children in 9th 12th Grade: Your student is ready for parent-guided independent work in our DECLARE curriculum for high schoolers.
